Academic Program

The Department of Music leads students to integrate creative and practical musical skills with critical thinking and intellectual inquiry, empowering them for a lifetime of learning. The curriculum provides and excellent foundation that prepares students to be adaptive leaders equipped to actively engage in their communities through the arts. The Department of Music welcomes students with diverse backgrounds, experiences, and musical interests and provides pathways for performers, listeners, scholars, and creators of all kinds. The curriculum trains students in music performance, composition, music industry, and research and cultivates the creative habits of mind that make sour majors competitive in a wide range of careers.



Teaching

Music faculty teach performance, music history and theory, ethnomusicology, composition, production, and entrepreneurship. Thirty-five are professional musicians, 75 percent of whom are principals of the Richmond Symphony Orchestra.



Performance Opportunities

Faculty-led music ensembles are open to music majors, minors, and other UR students who have an interest in music, regardless of major. All ensembles perform on and off campus each semester and several ensembles occasionally tour internationally.
